WE ARE KNOWN BY OUR FRUIT

This week, Jesus tells us that we must examine our own inner selves, our attitudes and dispositions, virtues and faults, rather than judging others. What is in our hearts comes out in what and how we speak. If our hearts are filled with kindness and compassion, those qualities will be evident in our speaking, just as beautiful, wholesome fruit comes only from healthy trees. And vice-versa. The Wisdom writer Sirach in the first reading agrees with this concept—that we will be judged by our words. Paul reminds us that the reward of discipleship is eternal life. Today's psalm of thanksgiving and praise reminds us of God's kindness and faithfulness, which we are to emulate in our thoughts, words, and deeds. We are known, each of us, by our own fruit.

EIGHTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

THE LORD BECAME MY PROTECTOR. HE BROUGHT ME OUT TO A PLACE OF FREEDOM; HE SAVED ME BECAUSE HE DELIGHTED IN ME. PSALM 18:19-20

The fruit of our speech and actions will wither and die (1, Ps) unless we first recognize the plank in our own eye (3). By humbly admitting our own sins, we can more fruitfully persevere in the work of the Lord (2).

The mouth speaks from the goodness of the heart.

EIGHTH SUNDAY

As we approach the season of Lent, Paul's first letter to the Corinthians gives us a sneak peek of Easter, waiting for us on the other side: "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" Paul's conclusion, telling us to remain steadfast and devoted to the Lord's work, could serve as a Lenten motto. The reading from Sirach provides a series of adages regarding discipline of the tongue, and of our speech. Maybe not a bad Lenten practice to observe. Even Jesus in Luke's Gospel gets into the act, encouraging a cleansing of the heart ("A clean heart create for me, God" we will sing in Psalm 51 during Lent), so that from the goodness of our heart we will bring good into the world. Of course, these insights from Sirach, Paul, and Luke serve us quite well year-round. What we truly do "in the Lord" is never done in vain.

IS THIS ON THE TEST?

Today's reading from Sirach reminds us not to praise others before they speak, "for it is then that people are tested." Jesus, in Luke's Gospel, takes it a step further, reminding us that we are also known by the fruit borne in our lives. It doesn't take long to think of a person or group of people who speak beautiful, praiseworthy words, and yet their lives are unfruitful, or their lives outright contradict their speech. This is the class of people we call "hypocrites," and it's clear in all the Gospels that Jesus has no time for them. Our speech does test us, but the test is really to demonstrate that there is a connection between what we say and how we live. Expressed another way, this is the age-old discussion about faith and works. A truly deep-rooted faith will bear fruit in the works, in the actions of our lives. As happens so often in discipleship, we are dealing with the both/and, not either/or.

TALKING HEARTS

As disciples who follow Jesus, we believe that we are following God's very Word-made-Flesh. The theological term for this is In-carn-ation, the "in-flesh-made" second person of the Trinity. As followers of the Word, our words are truly important. Our hearts and mouths are wired together, as Jesus tells us today: "from the fullness of the heart the mouth speaks." This is yet another echo of the wisdom of Sirach: "Speech discloses the bent of a person's heart." Eventually, our words—and the other actions of our lives—will convey what is truly in our hearts. Perhaps the ultimate test of our discipleship is not merely our words, or even our actions, but on a deeper level the test is whether or not others will find in us God's word "in-flesh-made." Our mission is to be the Word-made-flesh, in the flesh again in our own place and time.

CRS Rice Bowl is Catholic Relief Services' Lenten faith-in-action program. It offers opportunities for your family to engage daily with the spiritual pillars of Lent: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. And it's an opportunity for us to come together as a community and support our sisters and brothers around the world.



During the 40 days of Lent, we will encounter stories of communities in Guatemala, Bangladesh and Rwanda where CRS is at work. We will be invited to eat simple, meatless meals from these countries. Through the stories, we'll learn about the principles of Catholic social teaching and ways we can put them into action during Lent and beyond.

Stepping Stones

“Honoring Our Past, Building Our Future” Progress Update

Design Work Progress

Last Fall, you may have noticed equipment and engineers conducting surface and subsurface research on our property. Soil samples were collected to:

- Analyze the site’s conditions (types of soils or rock, and groundwater)
- Determine the strength and density of the soil
- Identify any organic material or contamination present
- Make foundation design recommendations
- Consider natural hazards, possible fault lines, and offer solutions for foreseeable problems

We received a good geotechnical report for the location of our future church. Based on the results of the sample borings, the minimum anticipated drilled pier depths to support our Church range from about 16 to 22 1/2 feet below the existing ground surface.

Beginning last August, in-person sessions with our construction team began. Since August meetings have continued online, by phone and email with our construction team—Michael G. Imber Architects, Core Architects, Nabholz Construction, civil and structural engineers, and representatives from our St. Joseph Design Subcommittee—to clarify the conceptual design for our future church.

In January, we moved from Conceptual Design into Schematic Design (SD). SD will take our concept drawings to 2D, give us better take-offs for quantities of materials needed, and give better definition of what is included in the design. (Concept design can be abstract, while schematic design begins to articulate spatial and architectural elements.) During SD, we will have reviews of the cost of Phase I of our new Master Plan. These reviews will keep us on track for better pricing to meet our budget, while confirming that the submitted plans and specifications will meet our objectives of the project without significant changes.
